### **Admission Requirements**

Students shall be selected and admitted on merit without regard to religion or cultural identity and regardless of ethnic origin, colour, race, political opinion, or gender.

#### **General Undergraduate Programmes**

An undergraduate program is a two- or four-year program that individual's study at a college, vocational school, college or university after successful completion of high school or the equivalent. These programs build knowledge and prepare individuals for employment in a range of fields.

#### **Undergraduate Programmes NTIT**

The entry requirement to undergraduate Certificates courses at NTIT, the candidate should have Namibia Senior Secondary Certificate (Ordinary or Higher or a combination of both), Junior Secondary Certificate or equivalent qualification(s), provided that the candidate has at least E symbol or better symbol in English with at least a minimum of 15 points in Grade 10 or 18 points in Grade 11 & 12 on the NTIT's evaluation scale.

#### **Mature Age Entry Scheme**

##### **What is and why mature age entry scheme?**

The Mature Age Entry Scheme is an alternative admission route for prospective students not in possession of a Grade 12 Certificate or for those with a Grade 12 Certificate who does not fulfil the minimum admission criteria based on Grade 12 as well as prospective students with grade 10 or grade 11.

#### **Mature Age Admission Requirements**

The Pupil can be admitted to our study programs through the following categories. A pupil must at least fall under either one of the following categories below:

##### **Category One:**

The Applicant/pupil must at least be a grade 10 certificate holder/ must have a grade 10 certificate.

##### **Category Two:**

The Applicant/pupil must at least have a grade 10 certificate with a minimum of 2 years working experience in Health-related fields.

##### **Category Three:**

The applicant/pupil must have a grade 9 certificate with a minimum of 2 years working experience in Health-related fields.

##### **Category Four:**

The Applicant/Pupil must at least have a minimum of 10 years working experience in Health-related fields.



## Courses on Offer

### Nursing Foundation Courses

Fundamentals of Nursing is the foundation for Nurses. Nursing is the art and science that involves caring with individual, families and communities to promote wellness of wholeness. Nursing Foundation forms the underlying basis for rendering nursing care to individuals in all stages of development.

#### 1. Certificate in Health Caregiver, Level 4

A caregiver does not perform any medical duties for their clients. Typically, a caregiver will assist patients who need minimal care. Instead, they provide care in a variety of other tasks, such as dressing, cooking, cleaning, hygiene, and even running errands.

Grade 10/11/12 Certificate, 10 points and above with F or better symbol in English as a second language.

#### 2. Certificate in Nursing Assistant, Level 4

provides healthcare and support to patients in a medical facility. healthcare providers who assist nurses and other healthcare providers. Their main duties include offering basic physical assistance to patients, feeding patients according to their dietary needs and recording vital signs.

Grade 10/11/12 Certificate, 15 points and above with F or better symbol in English as a second language.

### 3. Certificate in Auxiliary Nursing Level 4

provides healthcare and support to patients in a medical facility. healthcare providers who assist nurses and other healthcare providers. Their main duties include offering basic physical assistance to patients, feeding patients according to their dietary needs and recording vital signs.

Grade 10/11/12 Certificate, 15 points and above with F or better symbol in English as a second language.

### 4. Certificate in Enrolled Nursing and Midwifery Science, Level 6

The certificate in Enrolled Nursing and Midwifery science is a program which enables pupil nurses and midwives to possess a graduate qualification to work as primary healthcare providers, specifically as enrolled nurses and midwives/accoucheurs to provide patients from all backgrounds and ages, with nursing and midwifery care.

Enrolled nurses practise under the direction and delegation of a registered nurse or nurse practitioner to deliver nursing care and health education across the life span to health consumers in community, residential or hospital settings.

#### Regulations of School Pupils

##### **Admission/ Entry Requirements:**

A pupil can be admitted to our study programs through the following categories:

##### **Category One:**

The Applicant /Pupil who is in Grade 11 must submit their 1<sup>st</sup> term school report.

##### **Category Two:**

The Applicant /Pupil who is in Grade 13 must submit their 1<sup>st</sup> term school report.





## **Regulations of Mature Age Entry Scheme**

### **Admission / Entry Requirements:**

The Pupil can be admitted to our study programs through the following categories. A pupil must at least fall under either one of the following categories below:

#### **Category One:**

The Applicant/pupil must at least be a grade 10 certificate holder and must be 25 years or older

#### **Category Two:**

The Applicant/pupil must at least have a grade 10 certificate with a minimum of 2 years working experience in Health-related fields and must be 25 years or older.

#### **Category Three:**

The applicant/pupil must have a grade 9 certificate with a minimum of 2 years working experience in Health-related fields and must be 25 years or older.

#### **Category Four:**

The Applicant/Pupil must at least have a minimum of 10 years working experience in Health-related fields and must be 25 years or older.

- We do not accept faxed copies of application forms or supporting documents.

### Online Application

- After applying you will receive an SMS of acceptance and follow the steps in the SMS.

### Certified copies of documents that must accompany your application:

- Identity Document/Birth Certificate (Namibian citizens); Passport (non-Namibian citizens);
- Proof of payment (e.g. original bank deposit slip) or receipt for applying manually and online;
- Latest school results e.g. Namibian Senior Secondary Certificate (NSSC);
- Current Grade 11 and 12 learners must apply with their mid-term results;
- Declaration and undertaking - If you are under the age of 18, the form must be co-signed by your legal guardian or parent.
- Mature Age Entry Scheme Applicants: Reference letter from employer indicating your years of experience as well as the job title.

### Registration

- Applicants who applied and they meet the requirements will be accepted that moment and they are required to settle their registration before the due date, which will be communicated in the acceptance letter.
